Congenital Adrenal Hyperlasia (CAH) is an inherited condition in which children are born missing an enzyme in their adrenal glands. Because of this enzyme deficiency, affected children are dependent on the daily replacement of two hormones (ideally as tablet formulations of hydrocortisone and fludrocortisone) for survival. Happily, with the correct doses, children with CAH should expect to enjoy long and healthy lives.

In resource-poor countries, such tablets are not affordably available. Families struggle to afford the medication they need for their child to live and many children die, or suffer the terrible side-effects of poorly controlled CAH.

CLAN (CAH Living as Neighbours) is an Australian-based charitable organisation that is committed to helping all CAH patients of the world - especially children in developing countries - to enjoy the highest quality of life possible.

CLAN's affiliation with the Royal Children's Hospital of Melbourne - specially its charitable foundation **Royal Children's Hospital International (RCHI)** not only ensures donations are tax deductible, but also allows for consultation with staff at one of the world's leading centres of excellence in the management of CAH.

Founders' Report

In late 2004, after reading articles on the desperate plight of families living with CAH in Vietnam, we were determined to effect change. By early 2005 the organisation CLAN (CAH Living As Neighbours) was operational, driven by a dream to unite the International CAH Community, and ease the burden of members who suffer tremendously in resource-poor countries.

CLAN gained rapid momentum and strong support from many quarters: health professionals; pharmaceutical companies; CAH Support Groups in the UK, NZ, US and Canada; individuals and families living with CAH; and friends, relatives and strangers who all believed in the concept, and helped make change a reality.

Although CLAN's growth was fast, it also occurred on a very firm foundation. Development

of an early strategic plan ensured that all activities were to build upon one of CLAN's five organisational pillars: affordable access to medication; education; optimisation of medical treatment; encouragement of CAH Support

Groups; and reduction of the financial burden of CAH that leads to poverty.

In one year CLAN has already achieved so much. Perhaps a real highlight is that medication is now affordably available to all children with CAH in North Vietnam and the Philippines. Whilst long-term solutions - such as

the registration of hydrocortisone and fludrocortisone in these countries - remain firmly on the agenda, we are proud that it won't be patients and families who carry the burden until these aims are achieved.

Of course, little would have been possible without generous OUL sponsors and donors, to whom we are most sincerely grateful. With their support, we will continue to focus on our strategic goals, aiming not only to expand CLAN's activities, but also to consolidate on activities already underway. Together, we believe that we will continue to effect change for good for CAH families around the world.

MedicAlert Australia Donates Bracelets

300 high quality stainless steel bracelets donated to CLAN for distribution to children with CAH in resource poor countries. The need for hydrocortisone in emergency is inscribed on each bracelet. These are joyfully received!

Serono Australia's Booklets on CAH

Donation of 120 booklets on CAH to CLAN for distribution to families in resource poor countries.

Registration of Florinef

Bristol-Myers Squibb will try and register Florinef in Vietnam and the Philippines.

Free Florinef Tablets in Vietnam

Bristol-Myers Squibb will donate free Florinef (fludrocortisone) for all Vietnamese children with CAH for the next three years.

Free Hysone Tablets in North Vietnam

Alphapharm donates free Hysone (hydrocortisone) for all children with CAH at NHP (the National Hospital of Pediatrics in Hanoi) for the next two years.

Affordable Access to Hysone

Alphapharm liaises directly with CLAN to ensure Hysone tablets are affordably available to all CAH patients in the Philippines and other countries where it is not yet registered for sale.

CLAN Sponsors New Filipino CAH Group

Donations from CLAN will enable this new group to access medication and resources needed to maximize support for CAH families in the Philippines.

Free Hysone and Florinef for Filipino Patients

CLAN donates one year's worth of free Hysone and Florinef tablets for all paediatric CAH patients at PGH (Philippines General Hospital), and will continue to support affordable access to same.

Promotion and Networking

CLAN develops pamphlets, business cards and posters to help with networking and promotion of activities.



In a very short time, CLAN has achieved outstanding results. My organisation, Royal Children's Hospital International, "Archie") RCHI (pronounced appreciates the help that

CLAN can give and the two organisations have shown themselves able to work very well together. RCHI (http://www. rch.org.au/rchi/index.cfm?doc_ id=803) aims to mobilise and co-ordinate the resources built up over more than a century at one of Australia's finest children's hospitals and make them available for development aid projects. All of the funding for this activity comes from philanthropic donations.

Our main sponsor, Atlantic Philanthropies (http://www. atlanticphilanthropies.org/ index.asp) has a particular interest in Vietnam and hence most of our projects are based I have been visiting there. that country for ten years and as an endocrinologist, I have taken a particular interest in the fate of Vietnamese children

Doctors in Vietnam don't often think of CAH when they see a baby with ambiguous genitalia. They, and also the parents, are anxious about treating children with steroids such as hydrocortisone because they fear the side effects. When a child with CAH gets sick, the parents and some doctors may stop the hydrocortisone instead of increasing it, thinking that the child has enough problems without the drug making the illness worse.



Ho Chi Minh City has very recently established Vietnam's first assay for 17 hydroxyprogesterone and it is wonderful that Dr Nguyen Bich Phuong is currently spending two months at RCH Melbourne, sponsored by RCHI, to study our management of CAH. Parent information literature has been translated into Vietnamese and is available on-line.

CLAN has done a wonderful job in engaging pharmaceutical companies like Bristol-Myers Squibb (BMS) and we are thrilled that BMS is now in the process of registering Florinef in Vietnam.

In the interim, they are donating Florinef for Vietnamese children with CAH. CLAN and RCHI have worked together to support Vietnamese CAH Club. the Attendance by Kate Hansen and Claire Henderson at the 2005 meeting in Hanoi was profoundly appreciated bν the 100 Vietnamese families who came to meet them. RCHI has made efforts to improve gynaecological services for girls with ambiguous genitalia due to CAH. Two RCH gyanecologists, A/ Prof Sonia Grover and Dr Yasmin Jayasinghe have journeyed to Hanoi to see patients and meet their colleagues, and Hanoi gynaecologist, Dr Nguyen Thi Tan Sinh, was quest at RCH Melbourne in November. In 2006, further medical education activities will be undertaken in Vietnam. In addition, it is our intention to facilitate the distribution of Florinef throughout the country with the assistance of the Vietnam Paediatric | Association to continue to lobby for the addition of hydrocortisone to the list of officially sanctioned medications, so that cheap and reliable supplies reach those who most need it.



RCHI welcomes collaboration with CLAN in support group activities for families, in fundraising and in its strong advocacy role.

The Price of Freedom

All children with CAH deserve the freedom to live their life the way they choose. Good health is an essential pre-requisite of such freedom, but unfortunately for many children of the world, the price of this is beyond their means. CLAN is in the privileged position of being able to help families and patients meet this cost, with the ultimate aim of freeing people of the burden that CAH too often becomes in resource-poor countries. As a result, we take fiscal responsibility very seriously.

For security and transparency, all donations to CLAN are handled by staff at RCHI, with official tax invoices issued to donors. Whilst CLAN enjoys an element of independence, in that it is able to prioritise

where monies are spent, all expenditures are monitored by the RCH Foundation, and CLAN liaises at regular intervals with RCHI staff to discuss spending plans.

When deciding where monies are to be used, CLAN holds to the primacy of affordable access to essential medications as a platform for change. We are fortunate not only that hydrocortisone and fludrocortisone are reasonably inexpensive, but also that two key Australian pharmaceutical companies are exceptionally co-operative in facilitating our access to these drugs.

Once affordable access to medication has been achieved, CLAN then shifts attention to finding sustainable, affordable, culturally sound solutions to optimization of medical treatment and the encouragement of local CAH Support Groups. Educational activities are also a high priority to CLAN given our firm belief that "knowledge is power".

In 2006, CLAN will endeavour not only to maintain current commitments, but also to strive for new opportunities to help CAH families in resource-poor countries achieve the freedom they deserve.

An excerpt from a letter to CLAN from an Australian adult with CAH:

"Thank you for what you have achieved in 2005 for families with CAH... I never stopped taking my meds because the side effects of not having them was worse than anything I could imagine. I can't even begin to imagine how these children cope with the emotional turmoil of actually living with the side effects of having limited meds. You have helped to lift that pain. On behalf of all the children who now have hydrocortisone and fludrocortisone, thank you!"
